Acquittal sparks questions about Kevin Spacey's future, particularly whether he should still be "uncanceled." It would take a concerted effort from A-list supporters to bring him back into the fold, and even then, it's uncertain whether he could overcome the lingering perceptions of abuse. For now, Spacey will be focusing on his personal well-being, as he takes time off from work due to the SAG strike. While this may be seen as a necessary step, it's also a reminder that his career has been forever changed by his actions. The comet has an estimated diameter of 0.8 to 24 km and follows a hyperbolic trajectory around the Sun with an orbital eccentricity of 6.145±0.006. This makes it the third interstellar object confirmed to pass through our Solar System after 1I/'Oumuamua and 2I/Borisov. The comet's nucleus is surrounded by a shell of reflective dust, making its size uncertain. However, estimates suggest that it could be around 3-5 km in diameter. On October 29, 2025, the comet will come to perihelion at a distance of 1.358 ± 0.001 AU from the Sun. Initial observations suggested that the object could be on a highly eccentric path that might come close to Earth's orbit, but follow-up observations revealed it was actually an interstellar comet with a hyperbolic trajectory. Pre-discovery observations confirmed this, including those made by the Zwicky Transient Facility (ZTF) and ATLAS. The comet has been found to have a reddish color in its coma, indicative of its age, similar to previous interstellar comets. However, immediate observations were unable to determine its rotation period due to the presence of dust in its coma. Further observations are planned for 21 July 2025 using the Hubble Space Telescope, which will help scientists better understand this unique comet and its place in our Solar System.The Sun with an extremely high orbital eccentricity of 6.145±0.006, making it the highest among known interstellar objects, surpasses even that of 1I/'Oumuamua and 2I/Borisov.[19] The comet's perihelion will bring it closest to the Sun at a distance of approximately 1.357 ± 0.0008 AU (203.00 ± 0.12 million km; 126.141 ± 0.074 million mi) on October 29, 2025, at 11:33 ± 00:17 UT.[6][g] At this point, the comet will be moving at its maximum velocity of 68 km/s (42 mi/s) relative to the Sun.[20][h] As it moves further away from the Sun, the comet's hyperbolic excess velocity will be approximately 58 km/s (36 mi/s).[3][5][c] Its trajectory, inclined at 175° (retrograde and 5° inclined), suggests that it originated from the thick galactic disk.[26][13] As 3I/ATLAS approaches perihelion, it will pass close to Mars on October 3, 2025, at a distance of 0.195 ± 0.002 AU (29.17 ± 0.30 million km; 18.13 ± 0.19 million mi), and then to Earth on December 19, 2025, at a distance of 1.800 ± 0.004 AU (269.28 ± 0.60 million km; 167.32 ± 0.37 million mi).[28] Its close approach to Mars may allow it to be observed with an apparent magnitude of 11, while from Earth, it will not be observable at perihelion due to the Sun and comet being on opposite sides.[11] The comet's expected size, estimated to be around 24 km (15 mi) in diameter if it were a dark asteroid, may actually be smaller due to its coma or shell of reflective dust.[10] Its activity level is suspected to be weak compared to other interstellar comets like 2I/Borisov, potentially leading to a nucleus diameter that could be up to four times larger than that of 2I/Borisov's.[10] The comet will not become brighter than an apparent magnitude of 11.5 and may be outside the reach of average observers with 50 mm binoculars.[31] It will also be less than 30 degrees from the Sun from October 1, 2025, to November 9, 2025.[32] ##"3I/ATLAS is a recently discovered interstellar object that is currently passing through our solar system. It was detected on July 2, 2025, by astronomers using the ATLAS (Asteroid Terrestrial-impact Last Survey) survey telescope. This third interstellar object is the first to be discovered in the inner solar system and has sparked significant interest among scientists due to its unusual characteristics.
