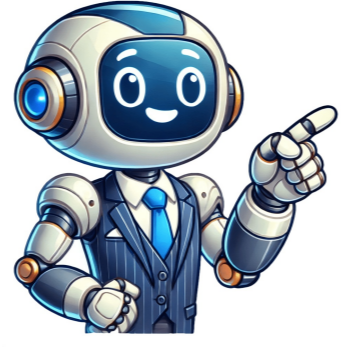

The Clans recognize two formal afterlives, StarClan[4] and the Dark Forest.[5] Outside of these beliefs and the warrior code, there are the Twolegplace rogues, BloodClan,[6] and an informal group of kittypets known as WarriorClan.[7]Each Clan (excluding StarClan) shares the same basic ranking system, consisting of nine distinct ranks. Introduction[] Making a fanmade Warriors clan and characters to go along with it, can be tricky. There are so many things to consider and cats to create! So, Hello! I'm Sunny, I've been creating Warrior Cat fanclans and ocs for a while and I've learned quite a lot on the way! I find world and story building so exciting because it's so intensely personal! You can add as many wacky things as you want and make it your own! If you're feeling stuck with boring characters in a boring setting, this guide will (hopefully) be a help! Thanks so much for reading, and happy clan-creating! How Many Cats Should I Have in a Clan?[] This is something I've seen many people struggle with. Not having an idea of how many cats may be in your clan can make it hard to stop or start! There are so many roles to balance in Warrior Cats, and only so many cats you can have. So, how do you find a balance? Typically, most clans are compiled of: 1 Leader, 1 Deputy, 1-3 Medicine Cats, 5-10 Warriors, 2-5 Apprentices, 0-3 Queens, 0-4 Kits, and 1-4 Elders. These are always subject to change, and you can always mix and match. The ranges are big because it's just a suggestion, and it is often what you'll find in most clans. However, you should find something that works for your clan! The main suggestion I have is to make sure that your clan will be able to support itself. If you have a large clan of say, 9 warriors and 5 apprentices, you might want to increase the number of medicine cats, as they need enough healers to sustain themselves. Unless you're making a troubled clan, you always want to think about how your clan can sustain themselves! As for the number of cats altogether, I suggest having 20-25 cats as a start. A little bit below or above is okay, but I don't recommend a clan of under 15 or over 30 cats. However, there are always exceptions. Your clan may be a tight knit rag-tag group of loners with only 14 cats, or a huge colony with fertile land and plentiful prey to support their 29 cats. Just make sure to consider where they live and the cats that make up the clan. A clan with 30 cats isn't going to be able to support itself in a harsh climate with little food. Plus, it also becomes overwhelming and hard to handle if you have too many cats! Make sure that you're not putting too much weight on your shoulders. How to Make Your Clan Unique![] Pick a setting for your clan! There are so many terrains to put a clan in to differ from a usual oak or pine forest! With a different setting comes different herbs, weather, animals, climate, and terrain for you to experiment with! This also gives you many opportunities for different names! Take a clan set in a tundra for example. There are so many animals unique to a tundra that can interact with your cats, such as snow leopards, walruses, bears, caribou, reindeer, and even whales! The introduction of new animals and naturally occurring resources allows new non-traditional names! Tundras usually have a harsh climate to survive in, which allows you to brainstorm some new difficulties and challenges that may arise for your clan. Additionally, you can create new traditions for this clan! Maybe your clan skins prey and uses their pelts as coats in winter? Maybe your clan has adapted to their environment over time and grown some new features to support themselves or maybe they've just moved here and they're trying to adjust! Don't be afraid to stray from canon a bit! That said, you don't always need to pick a unique setting. Forests are just as fun to plan and write and you can add your own twists on a plain oak forest! Some ideas for unique settings are: Desert Mountains Cave Meadow Prairie Beach Island Tundra Boreal Forest These are just a few!! I recommend doing your own research to find cool areas to put your silly little clans in! Another super cool thing you can add to make your clans feel more personal is traditions, holidays, etc! Go wild and crazy, because it's your clan! Change the naming system up, make a cool holiday, make your own religion, etc! This helps develop your clans and gives you fun events to create media about! Some examples could be: A clan that does not believe in StarClan, a clan that has a religion but worships something other than StarClan, leaders get no extra lives, cats don't have suffixes until they become warriors/full medicine cats, all kits are named after deceased warriors, and more! There are so many things you can do just to spice up your story, and they don't even have to be this drastic. You can even just add another term or word in for fun (like a cat curse word or something, hehe)! Methods of Naming Cats![] Typically, naming will go a bit like this. Prefix: Something having to do with the physical appearance of a cat Suffix: Something having to do with a prominent personality trait or accomplishment of a cat For example, a cat may be named Nightkit because of their jet black fur and later be named Nightspirit for their resilience and strong personality. This is a great way to name cats, but it isn't the only way! Lots of people are very strict on the way they name their cats, and only stick to this way so everything makes sense. However, names don't always have to correlate to a character and can just exist because they sound nice. The only rule is to stick to things that cats know about. If a word is something a cat would comprehend, you can probably use it in a Warriors name! Your names can make as much or as little sense as you want, because it's your clan! The main point is to have fun, and you shouldn't feel trapped when naming your characters. People will often argue that a kit has to be named something to do with their appearance, because names wouldn't make sense otherwise, but there are loads of occasions where a kit wouldn't be named by their appearance. Sometimes a litter is named with a group theme in mind (like all kits of the litter being named after flowers) which wouldn't correlate to their physical appearance. Sometimes a prefix is chosen by the parents just because they think it sounds pretty or it's around the kit when they're born! This is basically how all human babies are named, so don't feel bad about naming a kit something just because it sounds nice. Kits are also often named in honor of deceased warriors. There are many situations where their appearance doesn't have to be relevant. So, I'd say that naming should go a bit like this! Prefix: Something that has to do with the appearance of a cat, in honor of a deceased cat, in honor of a cat close to the parent(s), something that surrounds the kit at birth, or something that the parent(s) choose that sounds pretty or that they just like. Suffix: Anything the leader wants, but often something having to do with a personality trait or an accomplishment. Can also just be anything that sounds nice or completes itself (Like Jayfeather, Dewewing, Hollyleaf, etc.). Just go crazy and remember to have fun! There are very few rules in naming in my opinion, so don't let anyone rain on your shine! How to Choose a Name for a Cat![] This is the trickiest part when it comes to names! There are a few things you can do to make naming a bit easier! Use a generator! There are tons of free to use Warrior cat name generators online and some even give you an appearance or backstory with it. These can be super helpful if you're feeling stumped! You also don't have to use the exact name or appearance it gives you; you can always just take inspiration from it! For example, let's say you run through a generator and it gives you Valeriandrop, a brown and cream tabby with yellow eyes. Say you like the vibe of their name, but you're not feeling the prefix! You still want to keep it a plant, but you change it to Poppydrop instead. Now you have Poppydrop, a brown and cream tabby with yellow eyes. But, now you feel like they need a reddish color in them, so you make them a red and cream tabby with yellow eyes! Just by adding some modifications, you have Poppydrop, a red and cream tabby cat with yellow eyes. Generators can be a great help because they offer you a base, which you might need to make it easier! It also makes it easier if you need a whole clan and you want it fast. If the generator does not include an appearance, you can take the same steps with just a name! It also may help to choose a name and then make an appearance based off of it. It can be hard if you start with a cat that you know nothing about. If you have the name Birdwatcher, you may start off with the idea of a cat who enjoys watching birds instead of hunting them. You think they may be lithe and small because they need to sneak around when trying not to be caught by the birds and their classmates who they would get in trouble with. Maybe they live in a foresty area with tons of undergrowth, so they're a brownish cat that can blend in, and maybe they have feathery and long fur to allude to their name! Boom! You have a cat that you can play around with and mold to your desire as you continue your story! If you know the setting for your clan well, try to look up animals and plants that you can find in that environment! If you're making a clan that resides in a desert, try looking up animals or plants that live there! That way, you can get ideas for cats that directly allude to their setting! You can make cats like Cactuspaw and Tortoiseshop that have unique names that feel more in-tune with their environment. It also just gives you way more naming opportunities! I also recommend looking at pictures of real-life cats and coming up with names for them! Then you even already have a reference for them and a guide for how their markings and color may look! This doesn't work all the time, but it can be fun if you're in a pinch or just bored! Here are some general rules for naming cats! - Do not name a cat something that they wouldn't know about (this includes stuff that is naturally occurring, but that they wouldn't find in their environment) - Do not name a cat something contradictory (Like Dogwing or Badgerfeather) - Do not name a cat something repetitive (Looking at you, Twigbranch!!) - Don't use double animal names (Eaglecrow, Addersnake, Rabbithound) That's really it, so have fun! How to Create a Territory[] First, decide on the environment you're going to set your clan(s) in! This will help when creating landmarks and geographical features! Secondly, decide on where your clan's camp is going to be. If your clan lives in the mountains, is your camp going to be in the open? Will it be on a cliff or a cave? Where can they take shelter? Then decide what the area is like around your camp(s). Is the camp well protected? Does it have resources like herbs and prey? Do any other groups of cats or other animals live around there? Also research what types of plants and animals are there! You may have to keep in mind where certain animals or plants reside in order to decide where a camp can be. Think like you are the one living in that camp! You want to decide on a good area that will offer protection and resources. Unless your clan is staying somewhere temporarily or has to set up camp very quickly, most clans will be very considerate on where they stay, since it's where they'll be most often and their very survival depends on it. Think about landmarks that the cats may have. Usually each clan territory has a place to visit StarClan, so you may want to make one of those! You can use the Moonstone or Moonpool or create a completely new area by yourself. You can get pretty out of the box with these, especially if your clan has their own religion that differs from Starclan! Often territories also have a gathering place, hollows to train in, abandoned twoleg structures, remarkable structures like huge trees or boulders to mark their borders on, and areas that cats use to gather for ceremonies and celebration. You should also create something of a Highrock for your leaders! I recommend drawing out a map! It can be very simple if you want it to be, but it's good to know the general location of things in your territory. You can also look at fantasy maps online or even real life environments to gather inspiration for your clan(s) territory! Brief Step-by-Step on How to Make a Clan[] Decide where your clan is going to live, and create a name for your clan! Clan names are often relevant to their lifestyle or habitat. Do some background research on the environment your clan lives in! Look up what plants and animals live there and what kind of terrain it houses. Doing your research can be a bit tedious, but I promise it goes a long way in making your clan seem realistic! Brainstorm where your clan's camp may be, and start thinking about landmarks in their territory. Start thinking about cats! Leaders, deputies, and medicine cats are most important, so you should probably flesh those out first before you move onto the other cats in your clan! This also allows you to make dynamics between clans and in clans. Think about how your leader would have to rule their clan to lead them to success (or maybe another goal!). Maybe the leader and the medicine cat don't get along, or the deputy and the leader are in love and it makes their leadership biased. Clan dynamics are an important part of giving your clan a realistic feel! Plus, dynamics are just super fun to plot out. Once you have an idea of what your clans ideals and goals may be, start thinking more about what cats live there! As you go, also try and think about holidays, traditions, and customs that your cats may have that fit in with their ideals and morals. If you have a dreamy and idealistic clan, they may have an annual festival celebrating peace and love. Usually, holidays, traditions, and customs need a place to play out in! Use the ideas you already have about your territory to create areas that your cats can use for recreational activities. Once you have those fleshed out, territory making will be much easier! Finish up your ideas about territories. It's okay if you're not completely done! Things will also develop as you go. Create the rest of the cats and make some relationships and dynamics, and voila! You have a sort of fleshed out clan to build off of and tons of opportunities awaiting! Afterwords[] I hope my guide was thorough enough to help some people!
